

History of The Covenant School

The building located at 11685 Appleton was previously known as Bishop Borgess High School & Academy and was owned and operated by the Archdiocese of Detroit. In August 2005 the building transferred ownership to the New Common School Foundation.

Realizing a need for a Christ-centered high school education in the city of Detroit, the administration and staff of Bishop Borgess began the quest to keep this dream alive. In August 2005, The Covenant School became incorporated and was licensed by the State of Michigan. The Covenant School currently rents the building from the New Common School Foundation

A board of directors was established in October of 2005 and by laws were established and approved in November of 2005.

Today the enrollment stands at 152 and includes grades nine through twelve. More than 80% of the student population comes from the city of Detroit, and 99% are minority students.

We have and continue to accept students of all abilities and provide a variety of courses and levels to meet individual needs. The Covenant School has applied for accreditation by the Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools.

The Covenant School plans to continue the all-important tradition of graduating each senior and ensuring that each student is accepted into college.

Tuition for the 2006-2007 school year is \$4,595 for high school with an additional fund-raising requirement of \$450 per family.
